
## Create a GEDCOM file from Ancestry family tree

(in Windows, using Internet Explorer)

Access your tree in Ancestry.com by clicking on the **Trees** tab; select the tree to open it

Click on the drop-down list for the current tree and select **Tree Settings** 

On the Tree Settings page, in the "Manage your tree" section, click the **Export Tree** button

Down at the bottom of the screen, you will be presented with a message asking what to do with the downloaded file. Click the **Save** button (the file will automatically be saved to the Downloads folder)

Click the **Open Folder** button (this will open the Downloads folder)

Find the downloaded file ending in ".ged"

This is the file that you will send as an email attachment.
